We have a block of tickets for the evening of August 3, which is a Tuesday. We have 20 tickets, and will be spending the evening up in the RedBird Roost. Legislative Update

May, 2021 OEMOAA Chapter Military Officers Association of America (MOAA)

During the month of May, our Chapter and state-wide Legislative efforts were focused on conducting a "virtual" "Advocacy in Action", supporting three key and essential MOAA Initiatives.

MOAA "Advocacy in Action":

Topic #1: Toxic Exposure – TEAM Act (Toxic Exposure in the American Military)

Topic # 2: TRICARE Young Adult (TYA)

Topic #3: Basic Needs Allowance

Through our collective efforts and organized by our Missouri Council of Chapters president John Glenn, we conducted Zoom meetings with 9 of our 10 statewide federal legislators. Locally, we did meet with Senator Roy Blunt and congressman Billy Long. And, yes, they both personally attended and provided valuable input and support.

One of the easiest ways to engage with your lawmakers is to call their office. You may do so toll-free via MOAA's direct line to the Congressional switchboard at (866) 272-6622. Just ask the Capitol operator to connect you with your legislator's office.

- ✓ Senator Josh Hawley
- ✓ Congressman Billy Long

You likely will talk to a staff assistant or a legislative assistant for your member of Congress; their job is to hear your concerns and relay this information to the senator or representative.

- 1. Ask for their support for these legislative items (both in committee votes and in general session for final approval).
 - Cosponsor the Veterans Burn Pits Exposure Recognition Act, S. 437/H.R. 2436
 - Cosponsor the Toxic Exposure in the American Military (TEAM) Act, S. 927/H.R. 2127
 - Support H.R. 475, The Health Care Fairness for Military Families Act
 - Cosponsor H.R. 2339, support for our military families facing food insecurity
- 2. Ask for their support by becoming **co-sponsors**
- 3. Remind them that our Missouri Council of Chapters is scheduling a virtual conference with our Senators and Congressmen during the month of May.

Legislative Update (Cont'd)

<u>Missouri Veterans Commission and Missouri Department of Economic Development Launch New Benefits and Resource Portal for Veterans and Military Members</u>

The initiative for a one-stop-shop for veteran resources began after a University of Central Missouri research project commissioned by the Office of the Missouri Military Advocate. The project resulted in a 32-page document "titled "A Comprehensive Analysis of Missouri's Efforts to Improve the Quality of Life for Military Service Members and their Families," which recommended a centralized website.

COLA Watch

The April 2021 CPI is 261.237, **3.1 percent** above the FY 2021 COLA baseline. The Consumer Price Index for May is scheduled to be released June 10. The CPI baseline for FY 2021 is 253.412. The calculation is made by comparing the average CPI from July through September of the current fiscal year to the average for the same months of the year prior. Remember, active duty pay raises are calculated differently. This information is calculated from the non-seasonally adjusted Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W). <u>Missouri Senate Bill (SB)120</u> - Modifies provisions relating to military affairs On May 25, 2021 the final bill was delivered to the Governor for signature.

SS/SCS/SB 120 Summary - This act modifies provisions relating to military affairs, including state designations, hiring preferences and classifications for state employment, state agency services, school designations, military protections for motor vehicle insurance, and qualified military projects in the Missouri Works Program. Some specific provisions are:

- This act designates November as "Military Family Month" in Missouri
- Modifies the definition of "surviving spouse" in provisions of law relating to the merit system
- Creates the Missouri Department of the National Guard which shall be headed by the Adjutant General
- The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education shall designate a school district as a purple star campus if the school district applies and qualifies for the designation.

June US Military History

- 1789 US Constitution, enacted as Sovereign Law, goes into effect
- 1877 Henry Ossian Flipper, born a slave in Thomasville, Georgia, in 1856, is the first African American cadet to graduate from the United States Military Academy at West Point, New York. Flipper was never spoken to by a white cadet, during his four years at West Point
- 1942 Japanese Admiral Chuichi Nagumo, commander of the fleet that attacked Pearl Harbor, launches a raid on Midway Island with almost the entirety of the Japanese navy.
- 1944 The U-505 became the first enemy submarine captured by the U.S. Navy under Admiral Dan Gallery.
- 1950 Armed forces from Communist North Korea, smash into South Korea, setting off the Korean War
- 1979 During a summit meeting in Vienna, President Jimmy Carter and Soviet leader Leonid Brezhnev sign the SALT-II agreement, providing guidelines for limiting nuclear weapons
- 1991 Mount Pinatubo (4,750 feet high) erupted, forcing closure of Clark Air Force Base
- 2001 Timothy McVeigh executed at Federal Prison in Terre Haute, Ind., for the April 19, 1995 Oklahoma City bombing.
